In My Life This Week

As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.

Monday. The Passover in Egypt is familiar. God told the Hebrews to get ready to move out, to leave Egypt. God prepared Moses and the people, even giving them favor with the Egyptians. Thank God that He prepares His people for the good plans He has for them, including you.

Tuesday. The truth of the Passover in Christ is foundational in Scripture, but sometimes is not tied to the Old Testament Passover as it should be. As the apostle Paul declared, “Christ our Passover also has been sacrificed” (1 Corinthians 5:7). The Old Testament Passover was real, vital, but it pictured the greater Passover in Christ providing for our redemption. Think about this, praise and thank God for it throughout the day.

Wednesday. Christ’s Passover work provided for our redemption. It also brings benefits with our redemption. It frees us from futility (see 1 Peter 1:18-19), from being dominated by sin (see Romans 6:14), and from the curse of the Law (see Galatians 3:13). Are you really living in these freedoms today?

Thursday. Christ’s Passover also frees us from being strangers and enemies of God to being His children and servants (see Galatians 4:4-5 and Ephesians 2:10). There is no greater freedom for daily life. Ground yourself and live in, live out being a child and servant of God.

Friday/Saturday. On Sunday we plan to continue the series with *Free At Last!* from 12:37 – 13:22. Read and think through this section as you prepare for our time of worship and what God has for us in this Scripture passage.
