In My Life This Week

As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.

Monday. Yesterday we looked at one of the most familiar accounts in the Bible, Israel crossing the Red Sea. There is plenty of action in the account with Moses, the nation of Israel, Pharaoh and his elite troops and the path through the waters. Remember, however, the central figure is God. Read the narrative account in chapter 14 and the song of deliverance in chapter 15 focusing on God. Record all the points you see about God in this record.

Tuesday. Israel was in an impossible situation—between an unbeatable army and an uncrossable sea. How did they get into this position (see 14:1-2)? What was their response (see 14:11-12)? God sometimes leads His people into impossible situations to demonstrate His love, power and faithfulness as well as to test and build our faith. Read the last sentence again, inserting "me" in place of "his people." How do you respond in your impossible situations?

Wednesday. God provided salvation for Israel, He made the way of escape for them. It began with holding off the Egyptian soldiers (14:20) and then dramatically unfolded as recorded in 14:21-30. Read these verses again. God has provided salvation for you in Jesus Christ. He provides the spiritual armor you need to stand firm and defeat the attacks of Satan (Ephesians 6:10-20) and temptations (1 Corinthians 10:1-13). God *will* make a way for you.

Thursday. The first thing we see after the crossing of the Red Sea is the people is Moses and Miriam leading Israel in singing a praise song to God (15:1-21). The song was preserved and sung down through the years. Read through the song, looking at how they praised God. Is your praise to God for making a way for you like this? Is it something you remember, repeat and use as a marker and builder of faith?

Friday/Saturday. On Sunday we plan to look at 15:22–17:16. Read this section in preparation for our time together.
