In My Life This Week

As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.

Monday. The waving of palm branches and shouts of Hosanna! have ended. Today our focus begins to shift to Good Friday and Jesus' death, and then to Easter and His resurrection. Even so, let the reality of Jesus being *your* king stay front and center in your mind. Today take an overview survey each of the five aspects welcoming King Jesus we looked at yesterday.

Tuesday. Jesus brings salvation, He has saved us and He calls us to celebrate that. Write out a list of the things your salvation has done for you, means to you. Keep that list for this week, adding more things that come to mind. Take time to pray today without any requests, but only thanking God for Christ saving you, thanking Him for all the things on the list you have made.

Wednesday. Jesus calls us to serve Him. We all know that. What is the state of your thinking and action about serving Him? Evaluate your service. Are there things or areas where God is prompting you to step out, even into something different? Are there some things that perhaps have had their season and this is a time to consider some new things?

Thursday. We want to please Jesus, but we don't always do that. We fail. We sin. Remember that Jesus mourns our disobedience and our indifference. Stay away from the extremes of thinking that your sin is not really that big a deal and that your sin is always with you, taking, keeping you down. If you have never done that, memorize 1 John 1:9.

Friday – Saturday. Today is Good Friday. Our service is at 10:30 a.m. as we remember Christ's death for us, including observing communion. Sunday, of course, is Easter. We plan to think about some things Easter is. Prepare to worship and celebrate.
