Theme: **Soldiers of Christ must engage the enemy in battle.**

A spiritual battle is raging—you are under attack!

1. The commanding general's attack against you. (11-13)
2. The commanding general's forces thrown against you. (12)

A spiritual battle is raging—get into the battle!

1. Recognize God has provided all that you need. (10, 11, 13)
2. Use what God has provided. (10, 11, 13)
3. Wage the battle actively. (10-13)
4. Wage the battle continually. (10-13)

In My Life This Week

As you use this daily guide, write out your observations and responses on a separate piece of paper and save them with this sheet for reference.

Monday. Satan and his forces wage war against God and His people. His name “Satan” means adversary. “The devil” means slanderer. The Bible describes him as the evil one; as a liar, accuser and thief; as a roaring lion, a destroyer and murderer. Christ sealed Satan’s defeat at the cross, but Satan and his forces are powerful and wage war against you—you are under attack. Are you alert and engaged in this spiritual battle?

Tuesday. Getting into the spiritual battles begins with recognizing that God has provided what you need (see verses 10, 11, 13). We will look at the parts of the “full armor of God” next Sunday. The battle is God’s and He provides all that you need. Thank Him for this.

Wednesday. Knowing God provides what we need to stand firm against Satan’s forces is only the starting point. We must use what God has provided—we need to take up, put on the full armor (scan verses 14-17). Do you have God’s full armor on today?

Thursday. With God’s full armor on we can stand against Satan’s attacks as we wage the battle actively and continually. Are you sensitive to Satan’s forces using situations and events to lead you away from God and His truth, to destroy your peace, love and holiness in Christ? We can never claim “The devil made me do it!” We must actively and continually be armed, engaged and standing firm.

Friday – Saturday. On Sunday we plan to look at 6:14-17. Read and think through these verses as you prepare for our time of worship together.
